PASTOR'S COLUMN



As days grow shorter, leaves fall from trees, and sweater-weather begins to set in, the Church calls to mind those who have died and of Jesus' promise of eternal life. Earlier this week we honored the saints on All Saints Day and remembered our beloved dead on All Souls Day. Today we hear Jesus affirm the resurrection of the dead when faced with a group of religious authorities who refuse to accept it. Friends, may our faith in Jesus, who is the resurrection and the life, give us hope during these dark and increasingly cooler days.

This weekend begins **National Vocation Awareness Week**. It's a time for the Church to support and encourage an intentional disposition of discernment, that is, an active and thoughtful consideration of what it is that God may be calling **you** to do with your life (**vocation**).

Here are the steps for discernment for those who God may be calling to serve His people as a **priest** or **religious brother or sister (nun)**.

1. TAKE YOUR TIME: There is no rush in finding your vocation. It is best to be patient and allow yourself to enter into a deeper relationship with the Lord.

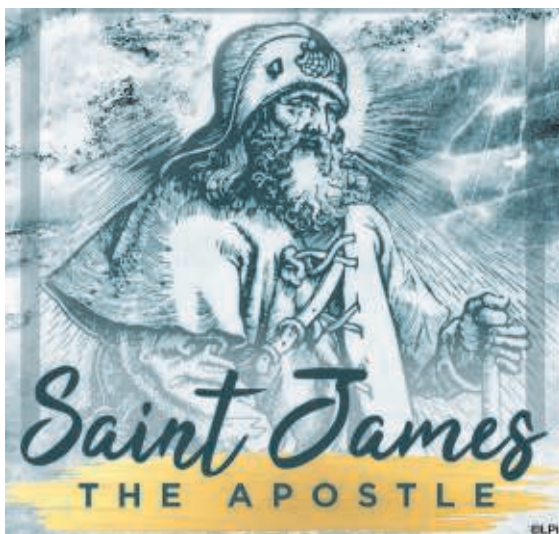
2. PRAY: In an interview, Pope Francis stated that "Discernment is always done in the presence of the Lord, looking at the signs, listening to the things that happen..." In this quote, we find a solid foundation for discernment. Take time each day in prayer (preferably before the Blessed Sacrament), entering into silence with the Lord and His Word, allowing Him to guide the conversation.

3. FREQUENT THE SACRAMENTS: Be sure to attend Mass on a regular basis, daily if possible. Frequent the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) at least once a month.

4. SEEK SPIRITUAL DIRECTION: Invite a priest whom you look up to and trust to accompany you. Meet with him every few weeks to discuss how your prayer is going and what you think the Lord is whispering to your heart.

5. READ: Learn about the priesthood. It is a great way to hear the Lord's call, as it will open your eyes to the wonder and beauty of this supernatural vocation. Reading the lives of the Saints can also be beneficial. Take a few moments each day to devote to good spiritual reading.

6. GET INVOLVED: Get involved at your parish. Ask about the different ministries and volunteer programs they offer. Some great ways to get involved include volunteering as a lector or Eucharistic Minister to help serve around the Lord's altar; teaching RCIA or Religious Education to help share and pass on the faith to others; helping with visits to soup kitchens, prisons, and nursing homes. All of these will help paint a picture of parish ministry.

News & Updates

Of the many successes from these past few months, I would like to highlight that the parish exceeded this year's Archdiocesan Annual Appeal goal!

Below is a chart outlining some of the details regarding our parish goal and our rebate.

As was announced in the Spring, any rebate funds from the Annual Appeal were to be used to refinish the 6 weather-beaten, large, exterior wooden doors of the church. We have done so already, and we are in the process of planning to refurbish the hardware of the doors as well. We may even have enough funds to repair water damage and stains to the narthex/gathering interior space, including a fresh coat of paint.

Saint James Campus Redevelopment Update

The Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for the school and convent properties were sent to over 50 companies. The submission due date for responses to the RFPs is November 17th. At that time, officials from the Archdiocesan Office of Property Management Administration, members of the parish's Campus Redevelopment Committee, and myself will evaluate the submissions.

My plan is to schedule a parish Townhall meeting shortly thereafter where parishioners will hear a presentation regarding the results of the RFPs and have an opportunity to ask questions. We are eager to review the proposals and present them to you.

Centennial Capital Campaign Feasibility Study

Thank you to everyone who has participated in our feasibility study regarding the potential construction of our parish center. The results have been very positive, and many families and individuals have participated thus far. If you have not yet participated, there is still time to participate.

We are working with the Archdiocesan Development Office who will continue to reach out to schedule time to speak with families. We anticipate more updates regarding the study and the parish center in the upcoming weeks. Thank you.


