

Monthly Meditation

THE PARABLE OF THE MUSTARD SEED (MATTHEW 13:31-32)

"Another parable he put before them, saying. The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches" (Matthew 13:31-32).

The parable of the mustard seed reflects the call to walk by faith, not by sight. It requires trust and faith to endure and be patient as it grows to fruition, a growth that is caused by God's grace alone. It also emphasizes the importance to sow the seed given to us by God, to actively walk by faith. If we do not till the soil and allow the seed to be planted, how can it grow?

Are there areas in my life I tend to walk by sight and not by faith? How may the Lord be calling me to trust Him deeper, and to actively take a step out in faith?










Those preparing to celebrate Eucharist for the first time must have prepared for and received the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation first. Catholics celebrate the Sacrament of Penance again and again.
