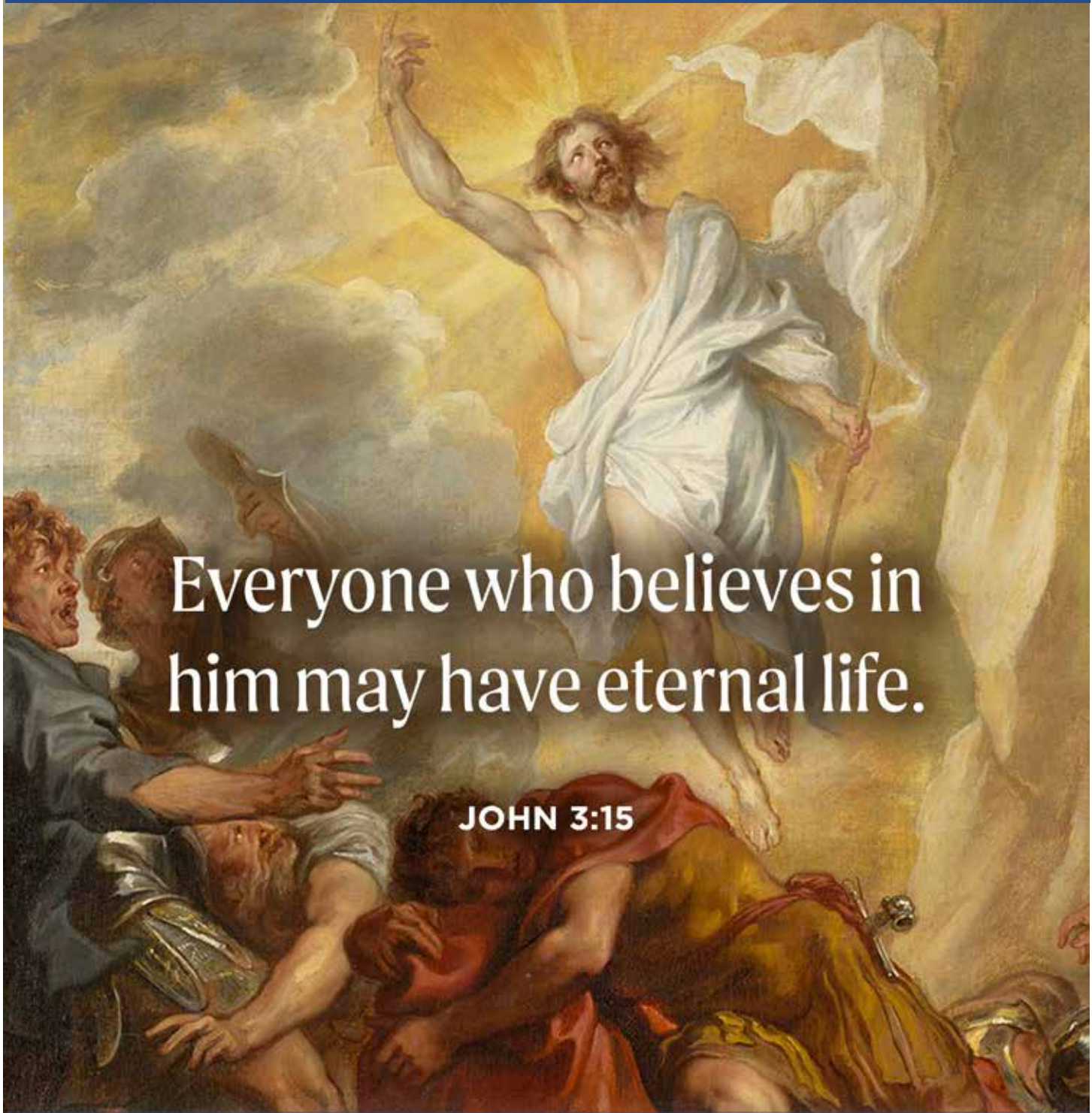

PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Friends, today we celebrate the Feast Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

This feast would have sounded very strange to someone in the ancient world! *Exaltation or triumph of the cross* would have been absurd and downright offensive to the ancient people of Jesus' time. It would have been analogous to someone speaking today of the triumph of the electric chair or the exaltation of the hanging noose.

The cross was a terrible instrument of execution used by Rome as a deadly threat to anyone who defied Rome's authority—including Christians who refused to sacrifice to Roman gods. The cross terrified people in Greco-Roman world, and that was the point.

So **why are we celebrating the triumph of the cross?** There is only one possible explanation, and that is the **Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.**

All the attempts to soft-pedal and explain away the Resurrection are ruled out by this liturgical feast because if Jesus was simply a victim of a terrible cross, then we should all go home.

Once the first Christians had taken in the experience of the Resurrection, they turned with fixed attention to the cross convinced that in it they discovered something paradoxical – namely, that meaning is found in the experience of **great, unwarranted, unsolicited** suffering.

Friends, the truth is that whatever your heaviest cross may be, there is extraordinary potential for that cross to become for you a source of incredible grace in your life and in the world.

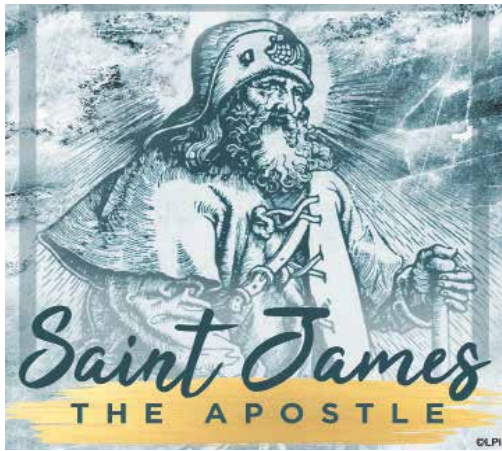

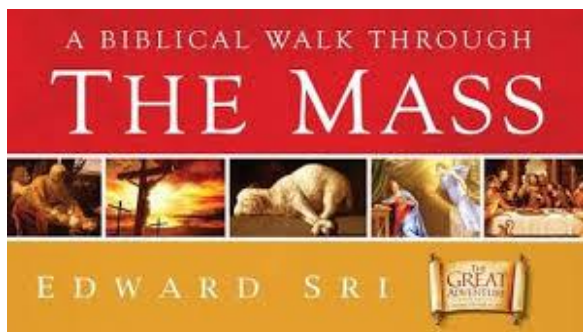


ST. JAMES TIN CAN AUCTION NEEDS YOUR CONTRIBUTION TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS
