

PASTOR'S COLUMN REFLECTION ON THE READINGS



Is it bad to be ambitious?

Jesus' disciples wanted to succeed. Well, don't we all? I don't like to lose at solitaire, much less at the great game of life. There are established measures for success in every avenue we care to stroll. In school you aim for the "A." In sports you want to score the point. In

elections you want more votes than the other candidate. At work you look for a raise. When you enter the contest you covet the trophy.

When Jesus and his apostles sit down to relax in Capernaum after a day of walking the hot, dusty roads of Galilee, he knows what they have been talking about along the way - success, glory, greatness. When Jesus addresses this openly the apostles are too embarrassed to admit it. But our Lord's response is surprising.

- He doesn't tell them that they **shouldn't** strive to excel, to achieve, to do remarkable things.
- He doesn't condemn them because Jesus knows that going great things for the right reason and making a **difference** in the world can be a powerful force for good which can give glory to God.
- This is one of the purposes of our lives: being a sign of God's goodness in the world by making a **positive difference** in the world.

So Jesus doesn't **scold** them for wanting to do something great. Instead, Jesus appropriately nests this human impulse for success by teaching them what true greatness looks like and for what purposes it ought to serve.

Friends, the great task for every Christian is not to achieve fame and fortune, popularity, power, and worldly success. Rather, it is the same task that Christ himself undertook: to serve others, to reach out to those who are **weak** and in **need**, like little children, and **to serve God's** purposes.

Jesus equates greatness in God's Kingdom with humility, an attitude of the heart that puts the good of others and the will of God ahead of one's own **preferences**. In short, greatness is exemplified in self-giving, not self-**getting**.


Jesus doesn't say to his apostles, "Don't strive to achieve great things," but he does point out where true, lasting, fulfilling greatness lies in loving one's neighbor and doing God's will. Jesus is the Servant-Lord; we his faithful disciples need to follow in those demanding yet fulfilling footsteps.


Registration will close on **October 15th**. No more registrations will be accepted after that date.

September is Alzheimer's Month

- An estimated 6.9 million Americans age 65 and older are living with Alzheimer's in 2024. Seventy-three percent are age 75 or older.
- About 1 in 9 people age 65 and older (10.9%) has Alzheimer's.
- One in 3 older Americans dies with Alzheimer's or another dementia. It kills more than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined.
- In 2023, unpaid caregivers provided an estimated 18.4 billion hours of care valued at nearly \$350 billion.
- Deaths from Alzheimer's have more than doubled between 2000 and 2021, while those from heart disease — the leading cause of death — have decreased.



UPDATE FROM JAMES McELROY



Hello, everyone! My name is James McElroy, a parishioner here at St. James along with my family. As some of you may know, after seriously discerning a call to the priesthood in recent years, I was accepted as a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Newark in the Spring of 2023. So far on this

new journey, I spent most of the past year at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, New York, in what is called the Propaedeutic Stage". During those months, my peers and I were more immersed in prayer, service (to the elderly and homeless in NYC), and discernment than ever before. I feel that even beyond discerning whether God was calling me to be his priest, I was able to - little by little - become more aware than I ever have been of His profound love for me, despite my many great shortcomings; the Sacred Heart of Jesus is alive and is longing for each one of us.

In May of this year, I completed my time at St. Joseph's, and spent about half of the summer assigned to St. Paul the Apostle Parish in Greenville, Jersey City. While there, I was able to participate in the day-to-day life of a busy city parish under the guidance of Father Joseph Furnaguera. The people of St. Paul's were so good to me, and their loving witness - like yours motivates me deeply on this journey!

And now, in September, I am a few weeks into my time at Immaculate Conception Seminary in South Orange, where I (God willing) will be for the next few years of my life, studying philosophy and theology throughout my formation. This new stage will be different, but I am happy to continue the path and to recognize everything as a gift. I am among good company here at the seminary and know that there will be good fellowship as well as formation with my brother seminarians. I thank you all from the bottom of my heart for your prayers and your kindness! I thank Father David for the opportunity he has given me to share these words with you, and for the great example he continues to put forward. Please know of my prayers and love for you all, many of you whom I have known since my childhood!

The Sacrament of Confirmation

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, we are sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation deepens the grace received at Baptism, and like Baptism we receive the Sacrament of Confirmation only once. Confirmation strengthens us to live as Christ's followers. Through Confirmation, we become more Christ-like and are strengthened to be active witnesses of Jesus. Our relationship with the Church is strengthened as well; we are sent forth to live our faith in the world. Those who have prepared to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation, called candidates, are usually confirmed by a bishop during the celebration of the sacrament.
