PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Our first reading from the Book of Numbers and our reading from the Gospel of Mark, both point to a very interesting topic. That is, the problem when we lose sight of our MISSION and we become our own worst enemy.

One of the most effective means of undermining your opponent is to divide and conquer. We know that if you set your enemy somehow at odds with himself then one can sweep him away easily enough. Let him fight himself and you won't have to fight him.

I'm reminded of the great fantasy and adventure created by J.R.R. Tolkien, The Lord of the Rings. In the vast and detailed world created by Tolkien, good and evil are constantly warring on expansive plains, ancient forests, cavernous mountains and fantastical lands, however, the most crucial battles in the great series are fought within each of the opposing side's camps. Think of the evil Orcs - corrupted descendants of the Elves (angel/saint like figures). They are fierce and intimidating creatures. So often throughout the Trilogy, the Orcs give in to in-fighting. And once that happens, all you have to do is just stand back and watch them destroy themselves.

But we also see this among the characters that represent good. The Fellowship of the 9, those who take on the mission of saving middleearth, also succumb to petty in-fighting and power struggles. They are constantly striving for control of the Ring of Power. Some even fall and are destroyed because of its enticements.

Sounds familiar. doesn't it?

You see, the enemy loves to sow dissension, rivalry, jealousy, turfwars because it takes our eyes off the MISSION at hand. And this happens, too, in our own lives. Often, we spend our energy not working for the Lord, but fighting each other.

Whether it's within the hierarchy of the Church, in our homes, in our relationships, and especially within our own hearts, there is a temptation to forgo the MISSION in order to defend our egos and our own needs.

A great example of this tactic is seen in both the first reading and our gospel. Friends, what mattered most to both Moses and Jesus is the MISSION that God has bestowed on them (and on all of us)!



September is Alzheimer's Month

- An estimated 6.9 million Americans age 65 and older are living with Alzheimer's in 2024. Seventy-three percent are age 75 or older.
- About 1 in 9 people age 65 and older (10.9%) has Alzheimer's.
- One in 3 older Americans dies with Alzheimer's or another dementia. It kills more than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined.
- In 2023, unpaid caregivers provided an estimated 18.4 billion hours of care valued at nearly \$350 billion.
- Deaths from Alzheimer's have more than doubled between 2000 and 2021, while those from heart disease — the leading cause of death — have decreased.



UPDATE FROM JAMES McELROY



Hello, everyone! My name is James McElroy, a parishioner here at St. James along with my family. As some of you may know, after seriously discerning a call to the priesthood in recent years, I was accepted as a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Newark in the Spring of 2023. So far on this

new journey, I spent most of the past year at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, New York, in what is called the Propaedeutic Stage". During those months, my peers and I were more immersed in prayer, service (to the elderly and homeless in NYC), and discernment than ever before. I feel that even beyond discerning whether God was calling me to be his priest, I was able to - little by little - become more aware than I ever have been of His profound love for me, despite my many great shortcomings; the Sacred Heart of Jesus is alive and is longing for each one of us.

In May of this year, I completed my time at St. Joseph's, and spent about half of the summer assigned to St. Paul the Apostle Parish in Greenville, Jersey City. While there, I was able to participate in the day-to-day life of a busy city parish under the guidance of Father Joseph Furnaguera. The people of St. Paul's were so good to me, and their loving witness - like yours motivates me deeply on this journey!

And now, in September, I am a few weeks into my time at Immaculate Conception Seminary in South Orange, where I (God willing) will be for the next few years of my life, studying philosophy and theology throughout my formation. This new stage will be different, but I am happy to continue the path and to recognize everything as a gift. I am among good company here at the seminary and know that there will be good fellowship as well as formation with my brother seminarians. I thank you all from the bottom of my heart for your prayers and your kindness! I thank Father David for the opportunity he has given me to share these words with you, and for the great example he continues to put forward. Please know of my prayers and love for you all, many of you whom I have known since my childhood!

DID YOU KNOW?

The Sacrament of the Eucharist

The Sacrament of the Eucharist is the only Sacrament of Initiation that Catholics celebrate again and again (after preparation for and first reception of the sacrament). The Eucharist is a memorial, a meal, and a sacrifice. Another name for the sacrament is the Mass. In the Sacrament of the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life, in Holy Communion and are nourished by the Word of God. The grace first received at Baptism grows in those celebrating the sacrament and they are more closely joined to Christ and one another as the Body of Christ, the Church, and strengthened to serve God and care for the needs of others.

As Catholics, we pray before the Blessed Sacrament. Our prayers show Jesus our love and devotion for him.
