



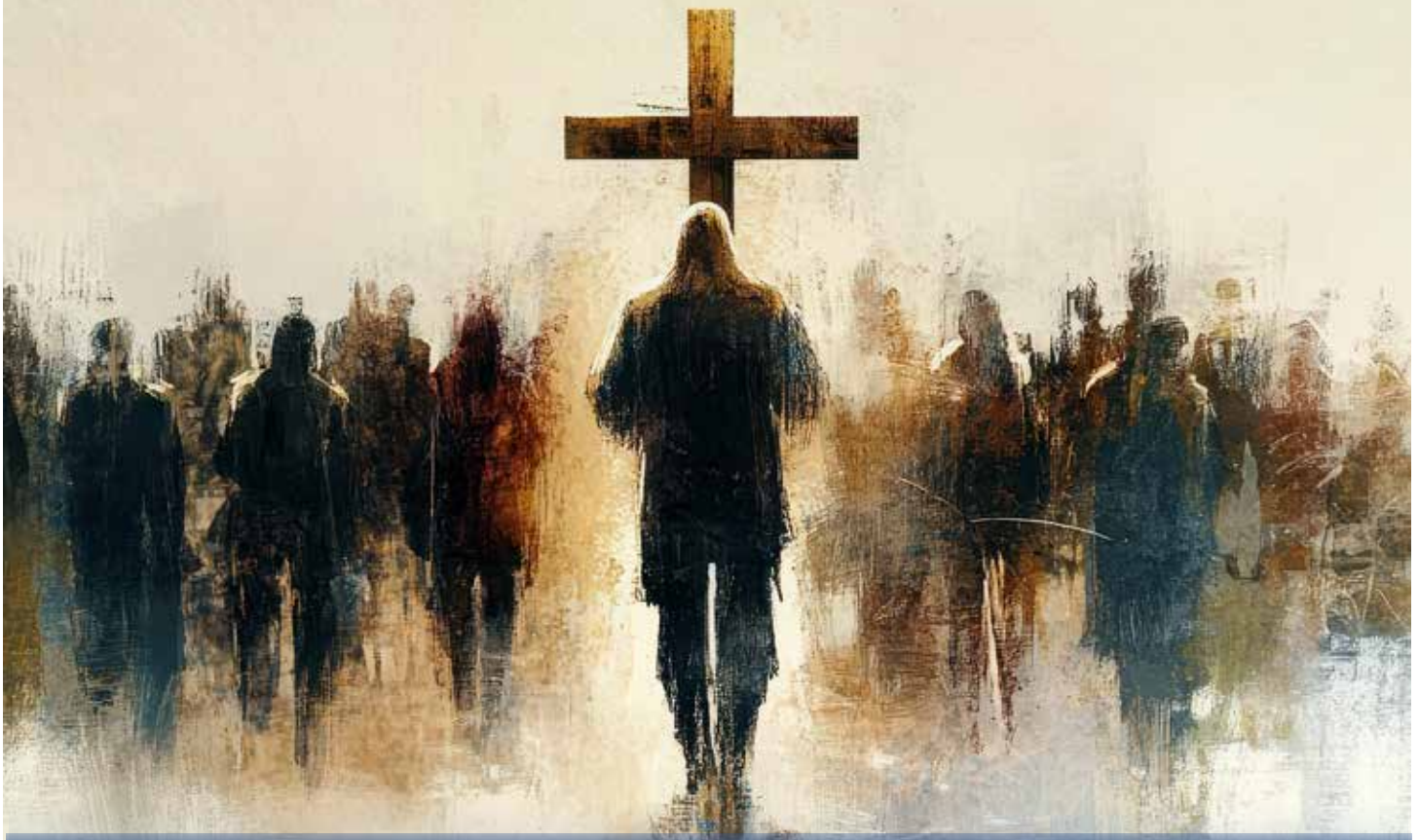

PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us with striking words: **"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple."**

At first, these words shock us. Hate those we love? But Jesus, the master teacher, uses hyperbole to grab our attention and point us to a profound truth about happiness.

Many of us chase an illusion of happiness, thinking, "I'll be happy when I get that job, meet the right person, or achieve my dreams." Yet, even when we attain these things, the joy fades, leaving us restless for more. St. John Vianney, the patron saint of priests, once observed that people are far sadder than they appear. He was right—**true happiness eludes us when we seek it in the wrong places.**

Jesus offers us the secret to lasting happiness: **a life centered on God.** He calls us to "hate" anything or anyone that takes God's place in our hearts—not to reject our loved ones, but to detach from anything that becomes our ultimate focus, whether relationships, possessions, or ambitions. As St. Augustine said, "Love God, and then love everything else for the sake of God." When we make Christ the center of our lives, true joy follows.

St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us, "True happiness springs from a heart filled with the love of God." So, let's ask ourselves: **What do I need to let go of to attach myself more fully to God?** It might be an ideology, a resentment, or even a relationship that's taken God's place. By reorienting our hearts to Christ, we discover the deep, lasting happiness we were created for.

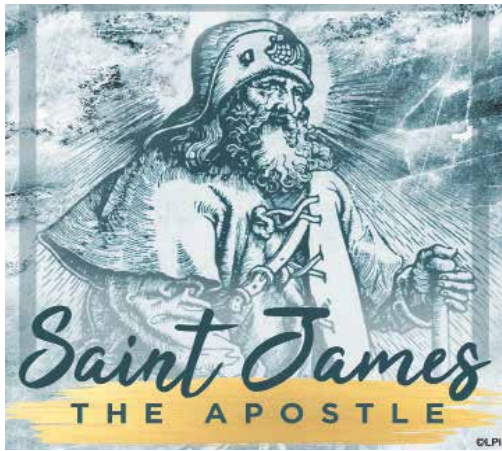

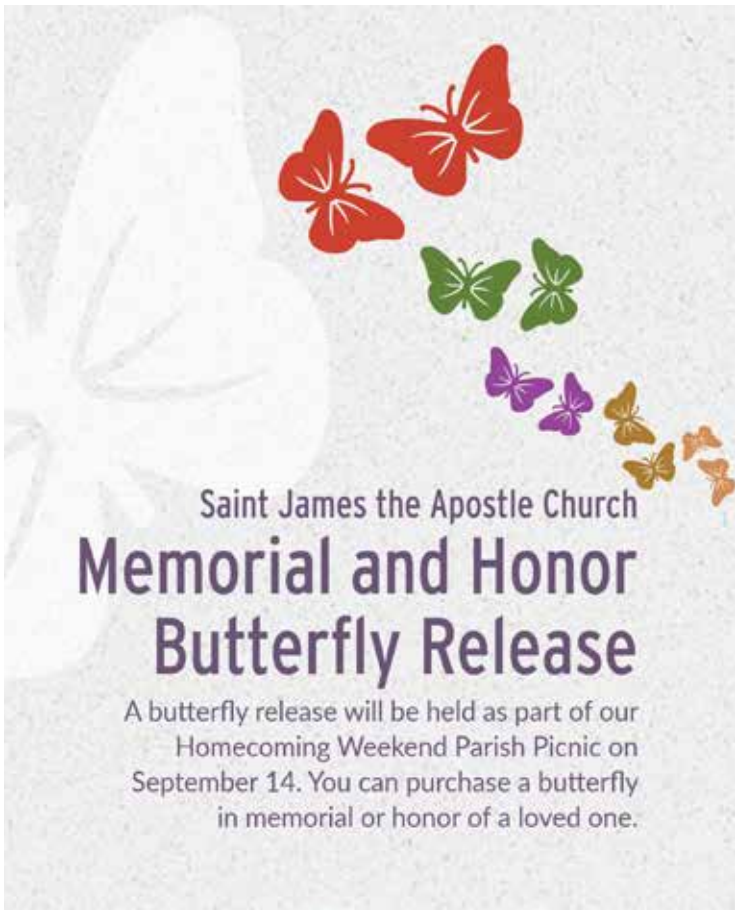
